# Education and Awareness

The University of Guyana Library plays a crucial role in supporting academic integrity and combating plagiarism. Here's how the library contributes:

- Information Literacy Session- The Library often organizes tutorials to educate students and faculty about plagiarism, its consequences, and how to avoid it. These sessions cover proper citation practices, paraphrasing, and the use of referencing tools.
- Access to reliable sources- The Library offers access to academic databases, journals, and books, ensuring that students and researchers can find credible sources for their work.
- Citation Management Tools- The Library offers training sessions on how to use citation management tools like EndNote, Zotero, and Mendeley effectively which help users organize their references and generate citations automatically, reducing the risk of accidental plagiarism.
- Inter-library Loan- If a resource is not available in the library, the University of Guyana Library often obtains it from another Library, further supporting access to legitimate sources.

### Featured Library Department

#### The Learning Resource Centre (LRC)

The Learning Resource Centre is the audiovisual arm of the University of Guyana Library, which houses study and research materials in non-book formats. The LRC services such as provides videography photography of events both on and off Campus on behalf of the University, facilitates for group and individual use of audiovisual equipment and materials, provides support for audiovisual teaching methods in all faculties and departments and also provide facilities and materials for self-directed learning. ## In-house Training Programme

The University of Guyana Library is hosting its Senior Library Assistant 1 (SLA 1) training programme which is designed to enhance the skills, knowledge, and professional development of library staff, enabling them to perform their roles more effectively and contribute to the overall success of the library. The programme includes participation from sixteen staff members, representing both the Turkeyen and Berbice Campus Libraries of the University of Guyana and thirteen participants from the National Library. The programme is a comprehensive initiative that enhances staff members technical, interpersonal, and leadership skills. It prepares them to meet the demands of a modern library environment, fosters professional growth, and ultimately improves the quality of services provided to library users.

### Farewell to Mrs. Gwyneth George



Mrs. Gwyneth George, AA, University Librarian (2006-2024)

Mrs. Gwyneth George, AA, was employed at the University of Guyana for over thirty years after working at the National Library for nineteen years. She also lectured on Guyanese History at the University of Guyana for three years on a part-time basis.

Mrs. George is a Guyanese national and holds a Bachelor in Library Science from the University of West Indies (UWI) Mona Campus and a Master degree in History from the University of Guyana. She has a distinguished career as a librarian, researcher and an administrator and was the recipient of several awards. Among the Awards were the Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU) Fellowship and the Commonwealth Fund for Technical Cooperation (CFTC) Scholarship. In May 2017, she was awarded the Golden Arrow of Achievement (AA) by his Excellency President David Granger on behalf of the Cooperative Republic of Guyana and in 2024, she was among the recipients for the 25 Influential Women Leaders Award (25IWLA), renowned as Guyana's foremost accolade celebrating women across all sectors.

Mrs. George's leadership skills have been exceptional which resulted in her serving on a number of Boards locally and internationally. She was a member of the Advisory Board of the National Library of Guyana, Executive Member of the Guyana Library Association, Institutional Member of the Executive Council of the Association of Caribbean University, Research and Institutional Libraries (ACURIL) and works as a Member of the DLoc Partnership Team. Notably, Mrs. George's leadership within ACURIL has been exceptional culminating in the successful bid for Guyana to host the ACURIL's 53rd Annual Conference in 2024, which has been described by both local and international participants as the most successful in the last ten years.

Mrs. George has several published works and was also a frequent contributor to the *History Today* series in Guyana's *Stabroek News*. She made several presentations to local and regional conferences and workshops and also played a pivotal role in developing programs such as the Institute of Distance and Continuing Education/UG Library Technician course. Her efforts have empowered many library professionals in both the public and private sectors to enhance their skills and pursue further education.



Randy M. Browne is a historian who specializes in the history of slavery and emancipation in the Caribbean, particularly in the British Caribbean. His work often explores the lived experiences of enslaved people, the dynamics of power and resistance, and the social and cultural history of the region.

Surviving Slavery in the British Caribbean examines how enslaved people in Berbice (a colony in present-day Guyana) navigated and resisted the brutal conditions of slavery. Browne uses court records, plantation documents, and other archival sources to reconstruct the strategies enslaved individuals employed to survive, including acts of resistance, negotiation, and community-building. The book highlights the agency of enslaved people in shaping their lives despite the oppressive system of slavery. Browne's work challenges traditional narratives that portray enslaved people as passive victims, instead emphasizing their resilience and resourcefulness. The focus on Berbice provides a unique perspective on slavery in the British Caribbean, as it was a smaller colony with distinct social and economic dynamics.
